New Building Renovation Status and Plans

Willow Tree Missions is searching for people with the desire to propel this mission forward! Your time, talents, goods, and financial resources over these next 12 to 18 months are not only welcome, but absolutely needed while we continue to prepare the new building at 100 E. Washington Street for the Willow Tree Resale Shop.

Our hope is to be completely moved in to the new space within the next 12-18 months! There is much work to do for the building itself, and we have already begun work in the smallest and least costly section that will be used as retail space. Our initial plan is to open up the section closest to Dr. Wintersteen's office this spring and then move towards renovating the larger spaces over the rest of the year.

Opening the smaller space will allow us to begin transitioning the Resale Shop uptown while renovation continues elsewhere in the building. Moving a small portion of the Resale Shop opens up opportunities for Willow Tree Missions to participate in community-wide events such as the Whites of Spring, the Reds of Christmas, and various other activities put on by the Chamber and Monticello Main Street, which in turn, could help us reach more families in need!

- The sprinkler project is on hold pending review by the City of Monticello, obtaining additional construction estimates or bids, and significant additional fundraising. Once we have a solid direction, we'll let you know and then we'll focus on the second-floor spaces and apartments.
