We have a few more volunteer days scheduled to help finish up the main room at Washington. Check out the schedule on page 8. Please let me know if another time works better for you or your team.

Since December 2022, Willow Tree Missions has been one mission with two locations. Volunteers, vendors, contractors, and team members equaling hundreds of people have invested 1000s of hours for the first-floor renovation of the Washington location. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! We could not have made it this far without your support!

Amid the construction, we have served 54 families this year alone! The need is real! We are excited to keep the momentum going and work on renovating the second floor next. The second floor consists of the Family Service Center, dedicated space for programming, and two transitional apartments. Funding for the Family Service Center and Resale Shop operations is from revenue generated in the shops, private donations, and volunteer hours. Funding for the renovation project at Washington is thanks to the Willow "Giving" Tree Capital Campaign, gifts in kind, local grants, thousands of skilled volunteer hours, and a major grant from the Illinois Department of Human Services. 

Renovation Update

Retail Space at Washington Street Nears Completion



In honor of October's Domestic Violence Awareness Month, a Grand Opening celebration to commemorate the opening of Willow Tree Missions on Washington Resale Shop will be the week of October 2 – 7. Different events will happen each day. The Grand Opening Celebration is scheduled for Wednesday, October 4 from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM with the Ribbon Cutting scheduled for 5:30 PM. The entire celebration will be open to the public and will include tours, refreshments, giveaways, and special bargains for shoppers!

The newly renovated space is the site of the second resale shop, known as Willow Tree Missions on Washington. The Resale Shop will feature clothing and shoes, jewelry, housewares, books, DVDs, CDs, pet supplies, electronics, home décor and seasonal items.

Willow Tree Missions resale shop at 351 W. Monroe will remain open but with a renewed purpose and aptly re-named, Willow Tree Missions on Monroe. All donation drop-offs will continue at the Monroe Street location. Current donation hours are Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Going forward, furniture and home improvement items such as bath fixtures, tools, appliances and building materials will be available at the Monroe Street location.

Family Service Update

How Does Willow Tree Missions Help?

How do I receive services from the Family Service Center?

- Call or text us at 217-631-1018.
- Walk-in during business hours at 100 E. Washington.
- E-mail andrea@willowtreemissions.org
- If you are not safe right now, call 911 or you can go to your police department, sheriff's department or courthouse (during business hours)

What does it look like to get an Order of Protection in Piatt County?

- Enter the courthouse and tell security you need an Emergency Order of Protection.
- You will be directed to the Circuit Clerk's Office on the second floor.
- The Circuit Clerk's Office will contact either a Willow Tree Missions advocate or the States Attorney's Victim Advocate to assist you with the court process.
- You and your advocate will meet in a private room so you can safely share and document the reason you need help.
- You and your advocate will go into court together, where you will be sworn in by a member of the court staff, and asked to share with the Judge why you need an Emergency Order of Protection.
- Assuming the order is granted, the Judge will sign and review the terms of the Order of Protection with you answering any questions you may have.
- You and your advocate will return to the Circuit Clerk's Office where you can obtain copies of the signed Order of Protection.
- At this point you will have an active Emergency Order of Protection.

What happens next?

- The Respondent (the individual you have the order against) will now be served a copy of the order by the Sheriff's Department. This can be as quickly as the same day or can take several weeks depending on the location of the individual.
- The Emergency Order of Protection is only effective for up to 21 days. A new court date will be given on or before 21 days from the date it is issued where you must appear if you wish to maintain the active Order of Protection.
- At this assigned court date, you and your advocate will return to court together. The respondent has the right to attend this court date.
- The Judge will ask if you are interested in seeking a Plenary Order of Protection. This means extending the order for up to two years.
- Assuming you want to remain protected, another court date will be set to give you and the respondent the opportunity to seek legal counsel. From there a hearing date will be scheduled where you can prove a Plenary Order of Protection is needed.

We will help you every step of the way and are here to provide support with the legal system as well as with the day-to-day struggles that come with living with, and fleeing from, domestic violence.
